We have discovered a diamond in the rough on Weirs Lake off Highway 25. When Paul's sister and her son were here for a visit, she said she wanted to go to eat at a very different restaurant as we were on our way back home from Silver Springs. I happened to spot the sign in the weeds alongside of the highway. The sign said Eaton's Beach Sandbar & Grill, with an arrow pointing toward the lake. Paul turned around and we drove down to the lake. What a surprise awaited us at the bottom of the hill.

4 months ago this lovely, open and roomy restaurant on the beachfront on Lake Weir was opened and managed by a couple from Green Bay, Wi. What a surprise that was to all of us. We liked the place so much that we went back with 13 people-mostly Stodola's from Wi. They were all impressed with the food and the atmosphere. It is beautifully open and airy place with a lot of seating. Huge decks wrap around the area for visitors to enjoy the view. The lower level is a bar opening up to the sand beach. Upstairs is the restaurant which rated 5 stars by all of us. We really surprised Barb Stodola. She was not expecting the place to be as great as it was.

The food-is sooooo good. Their gumbo consists of shrimp, chicken, crawfish and Andouille sausage, in a rich dark stew with okra, onions, peppers and celery. A large cup is \$4.99 .and a bowl

is \$7.99. Salads are unbelievable. I had citrus, glazed salmon with greens, bacon, tomatoe, blue cheese, hearts of palm, cucumbers, eggs and onions. This was served in a huge bowl with bread for \$13.99. It was delicious. Their signature dishes consist of shrimp, shrimp creole, pastrami, spanish catfish, cajun sweet fried chicken, mahi mahi, steak, bayou pasta, slow smoked pork. They also serve a variety of sandwiches and burgers. Their desserts are to die for. Having room for them is the problem. My first time there, the waitress spoke so highly of the pecan pie that I ordered it first and followed it with the Gumbo. Had to make sure I had room for the pie. The warm homemade pecan pie was served on a large plate with ice cream and homemade carmel sauce drizzled over all of it. No calories there.

We went for lunch but they serve dinners too. Wide selections of bar items are also available. Wait staff is so friendly and efficient. All in all a great dining experience.

The best thing about Eaton's Beach Sandbar & Grill is that it provides something for everyone: a mouthwatering menu, a full service bar, waterfront deck dining, fantastic service, and a relaxing and comfortable atmosphere. They're on

a mission to provide top-notch hospitality and the best restaurant experience in the area. They are off to a great start. Pssst..don't tell anyone!
