We discussed the 2017 non-fiction book *The Lost City of the Monkey God: A True Story* by Douglas Preston. This book chronicles an archaeological

expedition to a remote mountain valley in Honduras. Carol Roberts is recruiting members of the club to write monthly columns for the Seagull. Donna Johnson's review of November's selection appears below:

Preston presents historical research into the mythical Lost City of the Monkey God. He references accounts by Spanish conquistadors and by real - and fraudulent - 20thcentury explorers. Airborne Lidar, a modern scanning technology, suggested several possible locations for the city. The expedition helicoptered to an ancient, abandoned, untouched settlement choked by jungle growth. They found stone sculptures and vessels, and earthen plazas, terraces, canals, roads, and a pyramid. Their on-ground site assessment is a hair-raising tale featuring poisonous snakes, jaguars, rain, mud, biting insects, and severe cases of leishmaniasis, a potentially deadly disease caused by parasites that are transmitted by the bite of sandflies.

The Book Club discussed archaeological, historical, and medical topics inspired by reading the book, including issues around the current COVID pandemic.

The next meeting of the LST: Better Than Therapy Book Club will be held at 2:00 PM on Friday, 1/13/23, at the Clubhouse. We'll discuss the novel *Where the Crawdads Sing* by Delia Owens. To borrow library copies of this book, please contact Sue McFadden.
