**Recycling will continue to be put in the Lake County recycling bin (18 gallon)** *If you need a new recycling bin and are paid to date, please call 352-323-0824 before 12/11/15 for delivery at no charge* 

- There will only be one (1) pick-up a week on Mondays
- Full-time residents will be billed in 3-month increments @ \$18.75 per month
- Seasonal residents will be billed for 6 months
  @ \$18.75 per month as of January 2016.
- If you did not have trash service in 2015, you need to sign up by contacting Richard O'Conner (see number below).
- If you put your service on hold, you will need to contact Richard O'Conner to get your ser-

vice reinstated.

- This will cover your trash pick-up for the 2016 calendar year. When you leave in the Spring put your Progressive trash cart in a secure location. Then when you return in the Fall your trash will be picked up again once you place the Progressive cart at the road. Once you are paid for the 2016 calendar year you will not need to put your service on hold or call to start your service again.

In an automated collection system, the mechanical arm grabs, lifts and empties the cart and returns it to the ground.

> To help the collection stay on schedule, follow these simple steps:

> > Place the wheels of the carts toward the house. The arrow on your cart should point toward the street.

Make sure your carts are 4 feet from one another and mailboxes, parked vehicles, fire hydrants and other objects. The mechanical arms need adequate room to grab, lift and empty the carts without interference.

novel written by the famous author of "To Kill A Mockingbird" Harper Lee previous to the writing of her most famous novel. Lee had submitted "Go Set A Watchman" to an editor after it was written in the

1950's. The editor suggested that she might try again and focus on life in Maycomb, AL during the great depression that she had indicated in flashbacks in the novel. Thus "To Kill A Mock-ingbird" was written.

Lee's lawyer and friend Tonja Carter discovered the unpublished "Go Set A Watchman" and after Lee shared the novel with a handful of trusting friends, it was considered worthy of publication.

This novel reflects the grown-up Scout returning to Maycomb from New York City in the midst of the Civil Rights movement and her struggle with grappling with the realization that her father and her long time boyfriend Henry Clinton have abhorrent views on race and segregation. Scout is forced to deal with her feelings when she realizes that the Father who taught her everything she knows about fairness and compassion can emerge as a bigot. In addition the difficult relationship between Scout and her Aunt Alexandra is exposed.

This book is available through the Lake County Library System.


