Managers Corner

Are you ready????? I will be doing the 360 inspections this month (February). A number of residents have already received approval to paint their trim and/ or landscape their yards. It is a



simple process – bring a paint sample to the office for approval. You can proceed once you are approved. If you want to be creative with your yards, please submit a drawing indicating what you would like to do. Again, once you are approved, you can proceed. Thank you for your cooperation.

Our residents have been diligent about locking the clubhouse. If you find the clubhouse unlocked especially at night and over the weekend, please notify the office the next business day or put a note in the Rent Box.

Seawall Sidewalk: We have a "Good Samaritan" to thank for filling in the cracks on the seawall sidewalk. It was a very nice gesture but we can't have the cracks filled in. We have to measure the movement of the sidewalk and take pictures of it.

Friendly Reminder:

If you have family or friends visit you – you need to sign them in at the clubhouse. There is a sign in book next to the front door of the clubhouse.

Do NOT put paint cans in your trash. Paint cans need to be taken to the recycling center.

If you have an outside company or person trim your trees and/or bushes, please make sure they clean up the debris.

Speeding appears to still be a problem. Please observe the speed limit – 15 MPH.

We will be having the north seawall done this Spring. The office will need to know who has a key to your boat so that it can be moved.

Carole will be working on the storage and/or boat agreements this month. We would like to ask you to check your storage site and make sure that the item in your site is correctly parked in your site and not infringing on the site or sites next to you. Please take a few minutes to straighten up the vehicle parked in your site (trailer, car, motor home). More residents are signing up for storage and we need to ensure that when we assign them a site they can park their vehicle in their site.

Every resident should have a copy of the Park's Prospectus and Rules & Regulations. If you do not have them, please contact Carole @ 352-326-9455 and she will get a copy to you. These documents contain important information that you need to know before you proceed with projects outside your home.

Each month we will be reviewing the park's rules and regulations. Some of the information listed below is repeated from December's newsletter as we have many new residents who may not have not been here in December. This month's review will address:

Children: Children are not acceptable in the park, except for visitation of not more than fifteen (15) consecutive days or thirty (30) total days per year. Residents are responsible for the behavior of visiting children. Children up to age 15 must be supervised by an adult in and around all recreation areas at all times. (Rule & Regs #2) **Liability:** Neither management nor owner shall be liable for accident or injury to life or property through the use of recreation facilities, or for loss or damage caused by accident, fire, theft, or act of God to any mobile home. In the event

tenant has called for fire, police, or ambulance, please notify the manager at the same time. (Rules Regs #7) & Pets: A maximum of two small pets are permitted, which at maturity must not weigh greater than 20 pounds each. Pets must be confined to the interior of the home when the resident is not present and must be on a leash at all times when outside of tenant's home. They must be transported to areas outside of residence or common areas for exercise. (Rules & Regs #8) Window Air Conditioners: Window unit air conditioners are not permitted (Rules & Regs #12)

Please address all questions, concerns and complaints to the Manager so that issues can be addressed in a timely manner. We have a very nice, clean community and if we all work together it will stay that way for years to come.
