It seems like each year in January we speak about all the losses and loves you have lost. 2017 was a hard year....I will be coming before the months are over to begin my



If you have not had an opportunity to stop in and say hello to Nina our new Administrative Assistant please do and say hello to Danny our new Maintenance man.



A Cup of water

I grew up in the suburbs of Philadelphia in a town called Upper Darby. The town really grew after the war when returning soldiers bought homes using the GI Bill. It was a working class neighborhood and like myself, there were many children as a result of the baby boom. I guess it was a lower middle class neighborhood and most families were Italian or Irish. Fathers worked and most mothers were housewives.

My folks and I were lower income than most. Our furniture was hand me down 2 or 3 times over and the wallpaper was missing in spots. I never did without the necessities. I had food, shelter, clothes and love. Still, I longed to be like the other kids. Their families had cars, they went on vacation, and had lovely clothes. Though no one ever made me feel poor, I was acutely aware that we had less than most. Other kids did not have YMCA written boldly on their towels and I thought having sheets and pillowcases that matched was a real status symbol .No child ever wants to be different and I dreamed of the day when I would have nice material things like everyone else.

As an adult, I felt that I had 'arrived'. I had a great guy, a job that I loved, a nice car and I was buying my first house. I had found a moving company in the phone book and when the day arrived, two men showed up with a van. It was a more complicated move than normal because the furniture to be moved was scattered at 3 different homes.

The men were timely, polite and were very good, despite the fact that I was being a 'movezilla' overseeing my 'precious things'. The dining room table just had to be centered under

the chandelier and I hovered over them when they carried my Chippendale chairs. I was being a difficult customer but they never responded to my demands with anything other than "Yes,

Ma'am" They spoke to each other in a language I was unfamiliar with. I explained what I wanted to one and he would softly convey it to the other.

It is hard to explain how different these men were. They had an aura about them. A mixture of pride, strength, and humility. Their eyes conveyed a deep



pain I did not understand. It had been an especially hot day so, at noon, I made sandwiches and ice tea for lunch. They refused to sit on the furniture and ate on the floor explaining they were too sweaty to sit and possibly ruin my furniture.

As we enjoyed our break, I asked them where they were from. They told me Rwanda. The previous evening, I saw on the nightly news scenes from their country. A civil war had been raging there. The news showed a river that ran red with blood and was filled with so many dead bloated bodies they literally bumped into each other. I said to these men, "You were lucky to get out". They nodded. There was a long silent pause. Then, the one man said softly "Yes. I got out but my Mother did not. Every second of every day, I wonder if she has a cup of water". I immediately felt flushed with shame. Here I was, gloating, almost preening over my material things and this man was worried about his beloved mother having the most basic of human needs!

This brief encounter with these men has stayed with me all these years. My view of what is truly important is a direct result of their story.






