

Homeowners must be present at January's Annual HOA Meeting to vote for HOA Board candidates. Exactly 2 candidates from the slate of 3 **must** be chosen, or that vote will be invalid. Each HOA **HOUSEHOLD** can cast one ballot for candidates and one ballot for proposed Bylaw additions. Proxy votes may be used to vote on the Bylaws, but proxies cannot be used to vote for Board members. Individual HOA members may wield up to 5 proxy votes for other HOA member households.

Jim Filbert, Scott Greer, and Carol Roberts are qualified candidates for the 2024 LST HOA Board. Their biographies are below.

Jim Filbert:

Jim is the current HOABoard Treasurer. He's worked in this position on and off (mostly on) for many years. He also had Recording Secretary and Treasurer experience at retirement organizations in Ohio and Pennsylvania.



Scott Greer:

Carl Hiaasen was born and raised in Florida. He started his career as a newspaper journalist for The Miami Herald at the age of 23 as a graduate from the University of Florida.

From 1985 to 2021, he wrote an opinion column which, at one time or another, thrashed just about every major politician in the state. In 1986, he published his first solo novel which was **Tourist Season**. He went on to write eleven more novels which are set in Florida.... **Strip Tease**, **Stormy Weather**, **Lucky You**, **Sick Puppy**, **Basket Case**, **Skinny Dip**, **Nature Girl**, **Star Island**, **Bad Monkey**, **Razor Girl**, and **Squeeze Me**. I have read them all! His writing is considered to be savagely funny, riotous and cathartic in these novels. He has been called "*America's finest satirical novelist*."

Mr. Hiaasen has also written six novels for young people. The first one -- Hoot -- won a Newberry Honor and was made into a feature film. Through these novels, he introduces some of his wildest characters. They show how one can use their imagination writing books. Among Carl's writings are also three non-fiction books: Team Rodent, an unsparing rant against the Disney Empire; The Downhill Lie, which chronicles his return to golf after a 32-year hiatus; and Assume The Worst - The Graduation Speech You'll Never Hear. His books have been published in 34 languages.

Synopsis of "Tourist Season"

This book is a satirical mystery adventure about a crazed Miami reporter and an eruption of bloodlust meant to drive off the tourists and developers. It's December and the loyal Shriners have arrived in southern Florida for their annual Miami Beach bash.

Once you start reading, and using your imagination, you won't put it down.
