Book Reviews

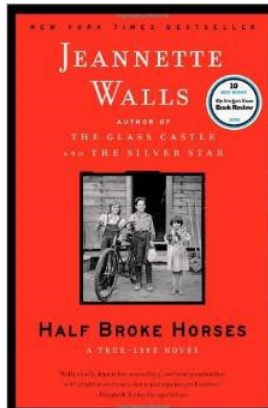
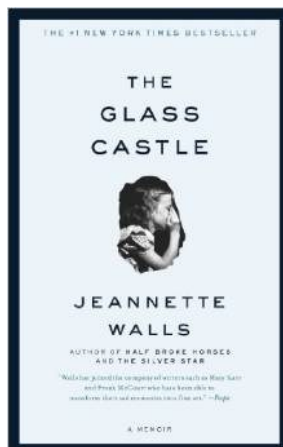

When our neighbor's Rob And Shirley Cruse loaned me "The Glass Castle", a memoir by Jeanette Walls, I discovered an amazing author. Ms. Walls graduated from Barnard College and was a journalist in New York. "The Glass Castle" was on the New York Times best seller list for more than six years. She now lives in rural Virginia with her husband, John Taylor, also a writer.

"The Glass Castle" is a remarkable memoir of resilience and reminded me of the Irish author, Frank McCourt, who wrote "Angela's Ashes". The book is a look into a family that is deeply dysfunctional and uniquely vibrant. When sober, Jeanette's father captured his children's imagination and taught them how to embrace life. When he drank he was dishonest and destructive. Her mother was a free spirit who disliked the idea of anything domestic and did not want the responsibility of raising a family. The children learned to take care of themselves and each other. The resilience of Jeanette and her siblings allowed them to become successful adults in New York City. Their parents followed them there, choosing to be homeless as the children prospered.

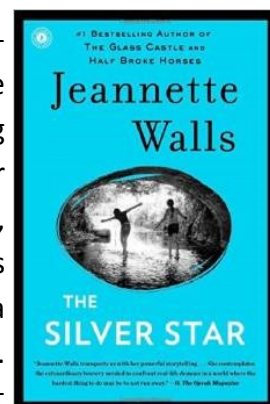
Walls calls her second book, "Half Broke Horses" a True Life Novel. The focus is on her maternal grandmother, who died when Walls was eight, but had a great influence on her. Lily Casey Smith was the daughter of a father who had a speech impediment



which overshadowed his intelligence and once spent three years in prisons for murder. Lily is a tough bird and her life as a child on ranches in West Texas and New Mexico is filled with chores and breaking horses. Her chance at education at a Catholic Boarding School was

cut short when her father spent the tuition money to buy dogs. She overcomes every set back and with no teaching degree land a job teaching school during World War I. She moves to Chicago and marries a thieving bigamist. She relocates to Arizona, goes to college and marries Jim Smith. At one point she supplements their income by selling boot leg liquor. Her relationship with her daughter Rosemary, who grows to be Walls' mother is a prickly one. Again Walls is a great story teller.

Jeanette Walls third book a novel, "Silver Star", has been on the best seller list for over eight years. Like "The Glass Castle" the narrator of the novel is a girl with an erratic mother and seems to be the author's way of delivering the wish fulfilling version of her childhood. The girl, Bean, whose real name is Jean, is growing up in the Vietnam Era early in the Nixon presidency. Bean's mother thinks she ought



to be a singer and leaves Bean and her sister Liz to raise themselves. When Mom runs off, the girls take themselves to Virginia and are taken in by their uncle. Their adventures and survival skills are further evidence of their resilience and determination.

Line Dancing

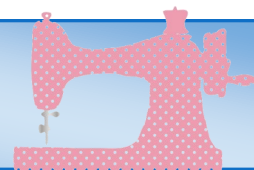

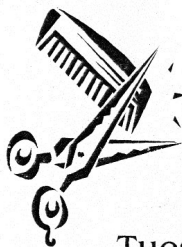
