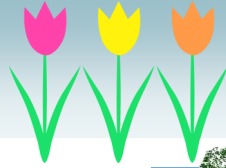


I always seem to begin each month with heartache over residents who have passed and losses of loved ones you have shared with each other. My heart aches for all of you..... Residents who will always be remembered.
