I really miss Halloween, the decorations, the kids trick or treating. Doesn't seem to be real popular here in Florida, maybe it is a Fall thing with the pumpkins and leaves. I do remember way too many Halloween's though were we were walking with the kids in parkas and boots due to the snow. It has been awhile since I posted a newsletter. We have been traveling the last couple of months and due to Internet issues have been kind of out of touch. I want to thank the rest of the Board for continuing on in my absence. Just proof how important a team is.

As we close in on the end of year we need to get our act together as we have the mandatory Annual meeting in January. It is vital that we have as many members as possible to attend because with out a quorum very little business can be accomplished. We need a minimum of 72 residences represented.

As most of you should know the Lot Rent letters went out in September. As expected the increase was substantial. According to everyone's Prospectus rent is increased based on the CPI. Due to inflation and other factors the CPI ended at 8.2 percent. That is the bad news. The good news is the Social Security Benefits will also be increased by a similar amount in 2023. Add in the other price increases we have absorbed over the last year and we are still getting screwed. The HOA is still monitoring the tax bill for changes that can be used to adjust the yearly Pass-Thru Tax bill in January.

We had a pretty light Hurricane season this year and to put it mildly we were very, very, lucky. Hurricane Ian just barely touched us here in the park. If it had come ashore where it had originally been projected we would have really been hurt. We were lucky. A particular bright spot, in my opinion, was the action of the HOA's Infrastructure Committee. Shortly after the storm cleared they did an inspection of the Park and a cursory inspections of the homes. Fortunately, they found very little damage, none critical. By them doing this checking and reporting, it would have enabled the HOA to get reports out to affected homeowners in a timely manner. I want to thank the members of the Infrastructure Committee for stepping up.

Happy Thanksgiving

One issue that has been before the Board all year is the need and/or selection of legal counsel to help advise the Board on issues. Particularly, loss of amenities, complaints to DBPR (Department of Business and Professional Regulation's), By-laws, and other issues. The Board's most recent vote was

4-0, not to go forward at this time with obtaining legal counsel. Not the result I was hoping for.



#### A Board member met with ELS

management on recurring issues. This meeting was put into a memorandum and shared last month with HOA Membership. Needless to say, things are moving very slowly or not at all.

Deb Brown, Chairperson of the HOA Nominating Committee has been seeking candidates for Board Positions to be selected in January 2023 at the Annual Meeting. To say it has been a struggle would be gross understatement. To be honest it always is. Over the years that I have been in this Park it seems like people need to be forced, almost at gun point to get involved. I probably don't need to point out that many residents are more the eager to complain

When Sue Furry and I initiated our club, we hoped for a close-knit but diverse group of women who could listen, discuss, learn, and support. And that's exactly what we got! We are, as Kim DesRochers says "an eclectic group of women, from all walks of life, spanning multiple generations, who all enjoy a common interest: the love of reading. We learn from what we read and from one another." Generous and honest in sharing our views, insights, and experiences, we gain knowledge, understanding, and empathy that enriches each of us.

We are fortunate to have Leesburg Library at our doorstep where we can source a wide variety of book club kits for our use. Each kit provides twelve copies of a selected title, which, this chapter, we will begin to share via partnering between members.
